Covid restrictions - DfE guidance updates

- DfE update on Face coverings:

*"Based on the current state of the pandemic and the positive progress being made, **it is no longer necessary to recommend the additional precautionary face covering** measures put in place on 8th March.*

From the 17th May face coverings will no longer be recommended pupils in classrooms or communal areas such as the corridors. Face coverings will no longer be recommended for staff in classrooms.

Children aged 11 and over must still wear a face covering on public transport. In accordance with PHE, they must also wear a face covering when travelling on dedicated transport to secondary school or college unless they are exempt.

*In all schools we continue to recommend that **face coverings should be worn by staff and visitors in situations outside of the classroom where social distancing cannot be maintained such as corridors and social areas**"*

In response to the above updates from Monday 17th May:

- **The wearing of face coverings will now be optional for students in and around school**
- **Any student travelling on the school or public buses must still wear face coverings when on buses.**
- **Twice weekly Covid testing - home testing continues until further notice. As per the guidance please continue to log the results with both the NHS and school log.**

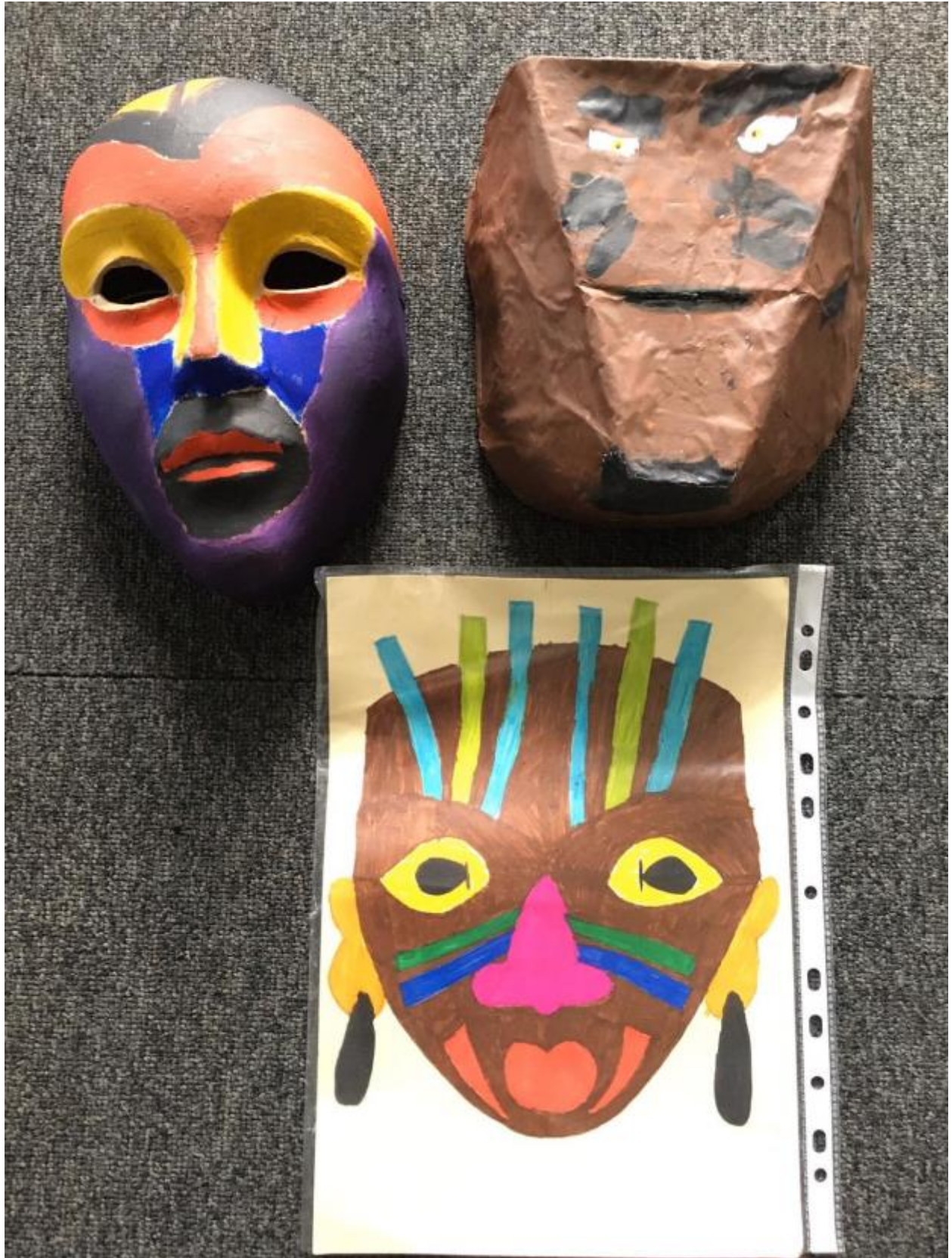


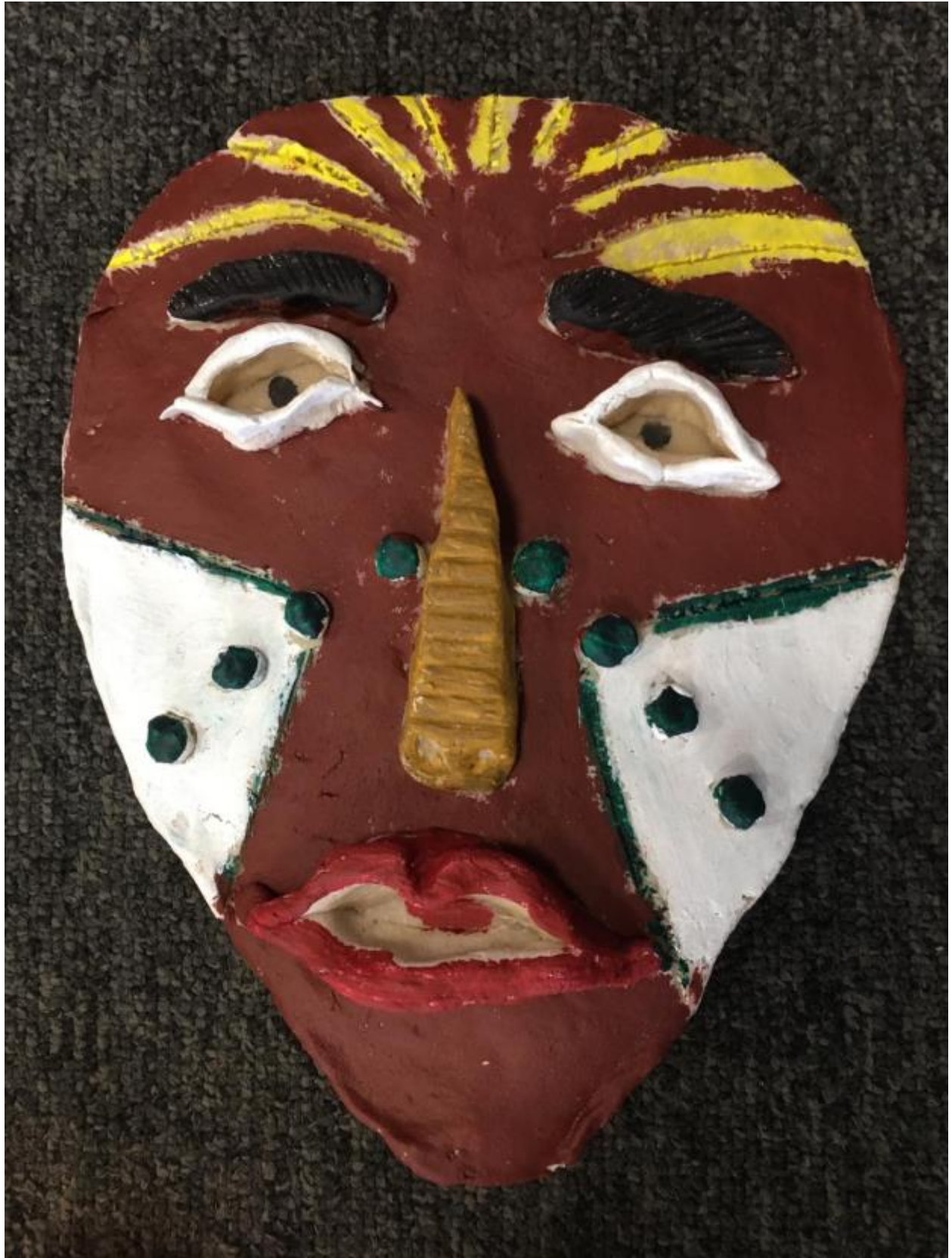










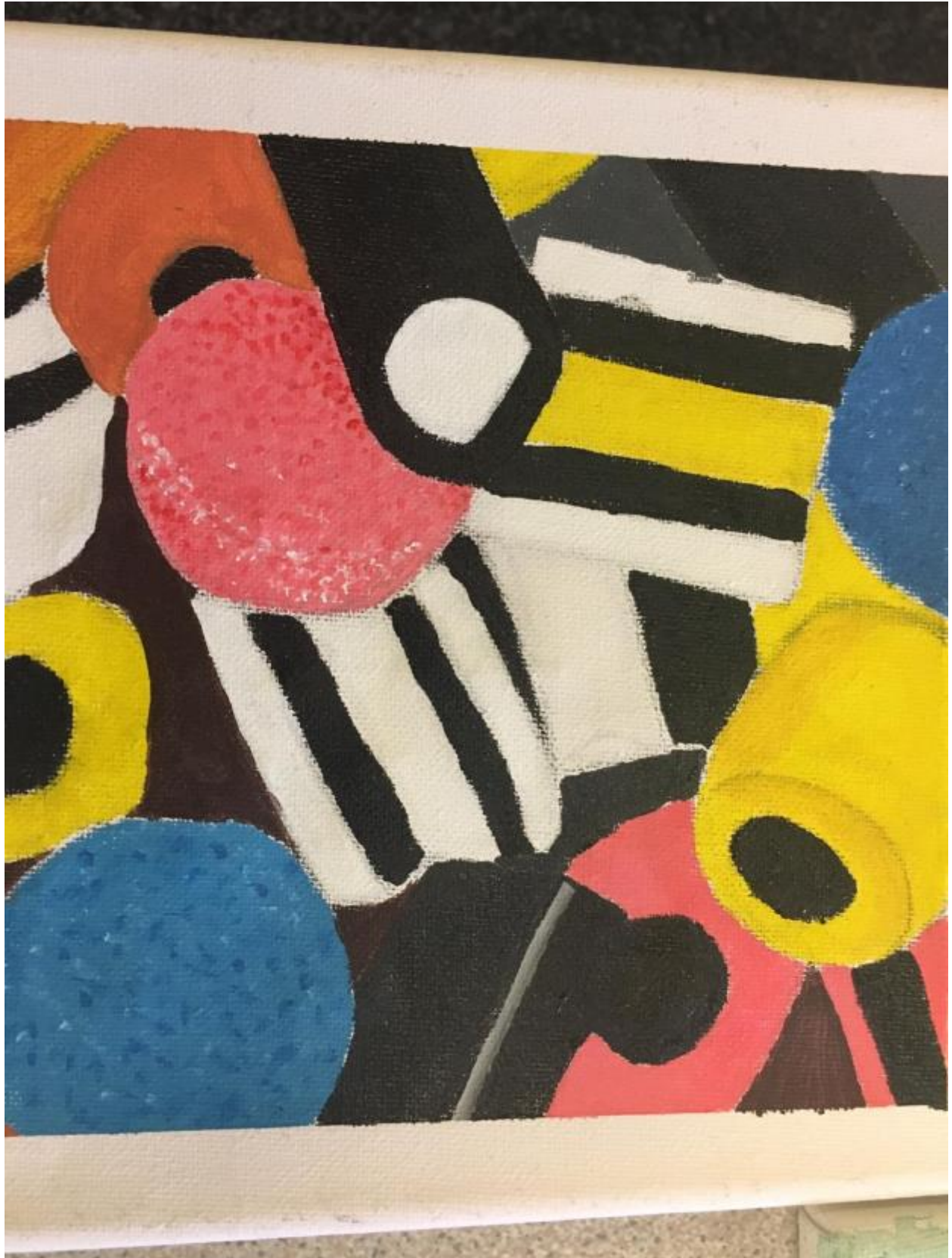












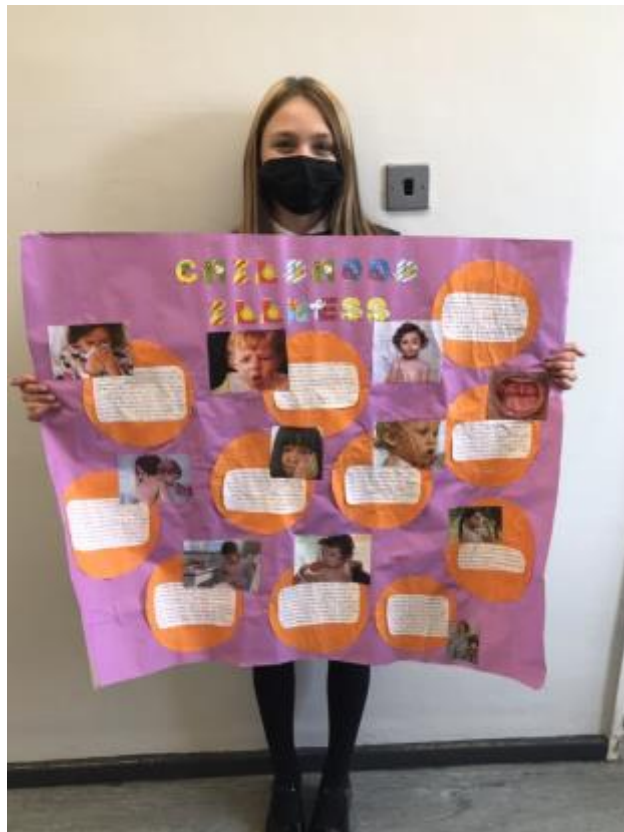






Year 9 Girls Child Development
