- Schools and local authorities have a new duty, required by the Department of Education, to promote **education**, **progress and achievement for previously looked after children**. These are children who may have been adopted, placed on special guardianship orders (SGO's) or a child

arrangement order (previously, Residency Order) from care. These new duties recognise that children who have previously been in care may well be eligible for funded additional support (Pupil Premium Grant Plus). - A reminder that students may bring umbrellas for damp days and that coats remain a must as the weather continues to turn more wintery. As per the government guidelines, we are keeping breaks and lunchtimes outside whenever possible. That said, please be reassured we do have **a wet weather contingency plan** to ensure that in torrential conditions we can protect the students and prevent them being drenched.
- PE kit is to be worn by students on PE practical days only (there is no need for PE kit on theory days for KS4 students despite what some may have communicated!)Park High Hoodies or plain black hoodies with an insignificant logo are accepted as part of the PE kit uniform.
- Masks. Children who do not arrive in school with masks will be given a one to ensure the safety of the school community but from Monday 28th September this will be accompanied by a misdemeanour. Two misdemeanours in one week is escalated to a detention.

Year 11 GCSE Assessment - Key Mock Examination dates

- Year 11 will sit a full GCSE English Language mock exam during the week commencing 12th October. This will be sat in classroom bubbles rather than the examination hall to ensure Covid compliance. There will be two papers: a 1 hour 45-minute paper and a 2-hour paper. In order to support students in their preparation, you need to know that they should continue to work on and learn their narrative writing piece, based this year on " A Childhood Memory" (they will use this same piece in their summer GCSE 2021). They also need to practice their skills in CQA(T) to answer questions on fiction extracts and non-fiction texts. All students are aware of their preparation needs. Click here for an example of a model piece of narrative writing (Grade 9) and click here for CQA (T) support material for parents who wish to help students in preparation for this mock. Working together will, without doubt, ensure we can maximise students progress and overall attainment. In addition to the practice above, reading a range of non-fiction articles based around current issues is also a good way to prepare for students to get ready for this exam.
- Mock examinations will take place in all subjects for Year 11 week commencing 9th November. More details will follow.
