Covid-19

 As announced by the Prime Minister this week, Plan B measures have now been removed in England, with a full return to Plan A. This means face coverings are now no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff, and pupils and students in year 7 and above but must still be worn on corridors and in communal areas until Thursday 27 January after which they are no longer recommended.

Seniors

 Student self isolation period can end if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school on day 6. Please note the first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to the <u>NHS Test and Trace</u> and to school on <u>Report</u> <u>student Covid home testing results to school</u> • People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time."

• COVID-19 lateral flow testing at home will continue twice weekly until further notice.
