
Congratulations to the **Pupils of the Week and top Park Point winners for this week!**

 Statutory guidance on the wearing of face coverings in communal areas and classrooms has now been lifted. We, however, welcome anyone's decision to continue with the wearing of face coverings and fully support everyone's individual decisions.






