Covid Contingency Planning

Despite the really smooth and successful start to the new school year with systems, structures and Covid prevention measures now well embedded to minimise disruption, it is only right that parents are made aware of the DfE contingency framework and our Covid Contingency planning. The guidance states that whichever of these thresholds is reached first:

"5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period; or 10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period"

...will require further action and the initiation of our Covid outbreak management planning which, in the first instance will include:

• The wearing of face coverings in communal areas for staff and students and if we were to reach the 10% threshold, the reintroduction of face coverings in lessons and communal areas.



This week has seen the launch of the new RISE time taking place during our form time (period 6). 'RISE' stands for reading, independence, study and extra curricular and has been introduced to ensure that here at Park we can continue to develop well rounded students who can fully embrace and enjoy all aspects of school life along side their subject studies. - We can model fluency to help you become confident and happy readers
- Correct pronunciation of unfamiliar vocabulary
- Enjoyment together slowing the pace and enjoying reading
- Guided through more challenging texts allowing you to gain access to more texts
- Exposure to more sophisticated vocabulary and texts adding to your word repertoire will help you in LIFE!
- Enriching- education
- We want to take you out of your comfort zones and help you enjoy a greater variety of text type
- Reading outside of subject lessons frees us from the restraint of content coverage / mark schemes and practice
 questions and fosters a love of reading lets enjoy together
- We can enjoy being read to just like primary school and our early childhood days

- The stories have been chosen to broaden your understanding and exposure to a whole range of historical, social and cultural and political aspects of our world –usually there is a message within each of the stories which will help you to learn how to be a confident and wellgrounded young person.
- We want to be able to help you navigate through the diverse and cultural world we live in with confidence.
- · WE really want you to enjoy and encourage you to read for pleasure.
- The stories should provoke discussion and debate this will help you to improve confidence in speaking aloud, having a voice and being heard. That said, as well as encouraging you to have a voice, we want you to understand the importance of individual opinions, recognising the views of others.
- You will read lots and lots of tier 2 vocabulary and build word knowledge.
 Tier 2 words are often not met in spoken language. Not every word will be remembered initially, but you will have the opportunity to hear them in context and consider other contexts and situations which you may use them


• Rainbows @Park High School
