• Year 11 mock examinations are now in full swing. Students have conducted themselves absolutely brilliantly and are working really hard. Examinations continue into next week.



Then Luke learns of the terrible truth of why children are being kidnapped and forced to work in the power station, and he becomes even more desperate to escape.






Revolver MARCUS SEDGWICK £7.99 9781444002409






