
linear (adj) – arranged in a straight or nearly straight line.

Covid 19

New guidance relating to Covid 19 from 1stApril

"The government have concluded that the population now has much stronger protection against COVID-19 than at any other point in the pandemic, so we can begin to manage the virus like other respiratory infections. From 1st April, regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting, and we will not be issuing pupils with test kits.

Children who become unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can return to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. If you do have access to Covid tests children with a positive COVID-19 test result should stay at home and avoid contact with other people **for 3 days**, which is when they are most infectious. They can also return to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend".
