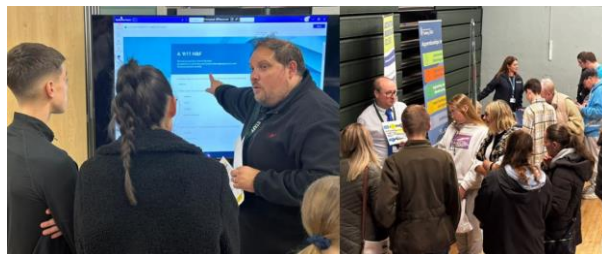


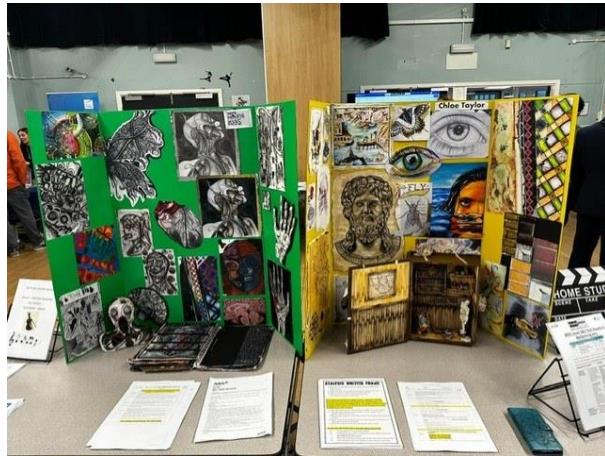






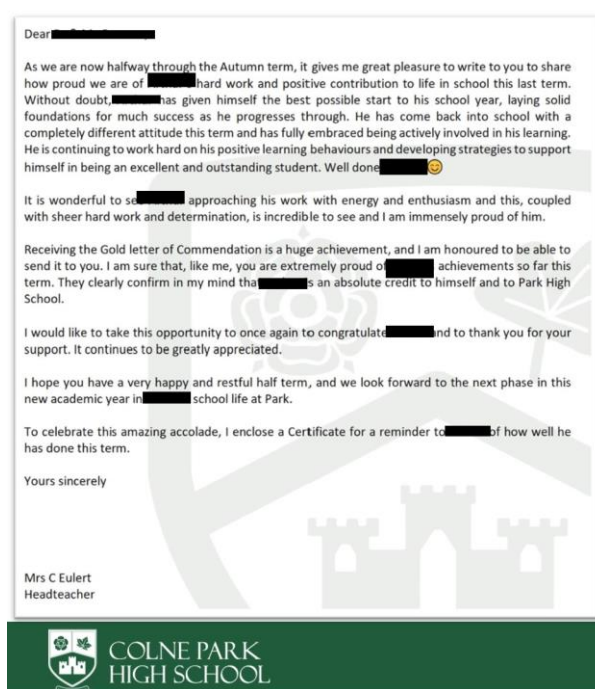






Headteacher Golden Letter Awards

Teacher focus this half term: Class Verbal Feedback

Here at Park, we place huge emphasis on being life long learners; the staff team spend a lot of time focusing on their own professional development to ensure they can be the best possible teachers of their subjects and their students.

Why are we focussing on this as a staff body?

Verbal feedback is an efficient and immediate response to move pupils' learning forward 'live in the lesson'. Giving feedback verbally means that teachers can **clarify and elaborate immediately**, ensuring that **misconceptions are not embedded**. Pupils can also **act upon the feedback** given straight away. Effective feedback tends to focus on the task, subject and self-regulation strategies: it provides specific information on how to improve.

Research shows that effective verbal feedback is extremely powerful as a tool to accelerate student progress, confidence and attainment. This is why as a staff team, **we have been focussing on getting this right this term** - and making sure our students are aware of this teaching tool!

Identify common areas of strength; when reporting back to students, it will help to stress the things that are being done well so that they are reinforced as well as serving as a prompt to the few students not yet doing them.

Identify specific examples of excellent work with the intention of showcasing them as models.

Highlighting pupil's work can be done through a visualiser, a reading of work or a live demonstration.

NOTE AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT

Reading through, make a manageable list of common misconceptions, spelling errors, technical errors and any other areas for improvement.

As the feedback will be public, don't attach errors to individuals.

Note students who you might need to speak to individually because of specific issues.

A/D/A/P/T

- As part of a diet of feedback, this technique is an excellent way to give students timely, detailed formative feedback whilst minimising teacher workload.
- It replaces writing individual comments in books with feedback given to the class as a whole.
- This allows the teacher to engage with the details of the work students produce rapidly, to inform a short, effective feedback and improvement cycle.

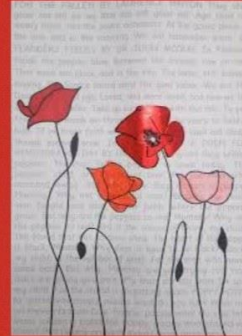
