Coming to Year 7 and 8 next week....



Wednesday March 6th: Personal Development Day

Year 7. Theme: Holi festival celebrations.

- Students to wear Park PE kit with t-shirts being designed and worn for colour run at the end of the day.
- Parents to complete Microsoft form which was sent out earlier this week if no consent is given.

Year 8. Theme: Careers

- Students to wear full school uniform.
- Some students will be visiting workplaces -parents of these students will be contacted ahead of Wednesday.

Year 9. Theme: Bronze Duke of Edinburgh. Practice walk around the local area, starting and finishing at school.

- Students will need clothes suitable for a muddy walk! Suitable shoes/trainers/boots with a good grip will be needed. They will need warm clothes (spare in their rucksack) including hat an gloves. A rain coat will also be needed.
- Students need to bring at least 1 litre of water, their will be opportunity to fill their bottle in the way round the walk.
- Packed lunches need (all free school meals students have been ordered a grab bag that can be picked up in the morning) and snacks for the day.
- Students are expected to follow the country code. All gates must be closed on the walk. Litter must not be dropped at any point. Students must keep away from livestock and stick to the paths. They must not climb fences or walls at any point.
- Many staff will be on route to ensure students are will guided on the route. If they think they
 are lost (they will be provided with a map and compass for the route) they have been
 advised to walk back to the last manned checkpoint for directions.
- The students have chosen to be in a group of between 5-6 students. As part of the DofE expedition they must stay in that group at all times. They must not leave the group, unless a medical issue means they cannot carry on they cannot carry on the walk. If a student is not well enough to complete the walk they will be taken back to school.

It is a lovely route and will be a great day for the students. We have many trained staff who have given up their own time to gain the qualifications so we can undertake DofE with an entire year group. We have also received some amazing donations so we can buy the kit needed to do the expedition.

If a student does not complete the walk on PD day week, it will not affect their Duke of Edinburgh award, but it is important training for what will take place this summer.






