Lancashire Cup Final

On Thursday evening our Year 7 Girls footballers played in the final of the Lancashire Cup. This is the first time in the history of the school that a girls team has made the final and throughout the competition they have been brilliant showcasing great skill but also a fantastic attitude.

The final, played at Darwen FC saw them take on 3 other schools, Archbishop Temple, Our Lady's (Preston) and Bishop Rawstorne.

In the opening game against Archbishop it was a very tight affair with both teams having chances in the early stages. Midway through the first half the girls settled a little and began to speed up their play which meant they began to dominate the game and just before half time Heidi scored to give us the lead. From there the girls worked hard to keep a clean sheet with Eleanor, Madison and Mia strong at the back. The final score was 1-0, an excellent start.

In the 2nd game we face Our Lady's who on Monday were crowned National Champions. Mr Morrison asked the girls to be more aggressive in their play and press the opposition to give them no time to play. The girls absolutely delivered with a fantastic performance that pushed the opposition all the way. In goal, Pola was outstanding making 3 brilliant saves to keep the scores level and Betsy, Heidi and Lottie in midfield worked unbelievably hard. Just as it looked as if the game would end in a draw Our Lady's broke through and scored with only 20 seconds of the game left to win 1-0.

The girls were disappointed but moved on to the final game determined to maintain the fantastic standard and work ethic they had showed. Against Bishop Rawstorne we went behind to an early goal but showed great resilience to come back. Upfront Poppy started to get chances due to her work rate and just before half time Lottie levelled the scores. In the 2nd half we pushed on, Mr Morrison making some tactical changes, and Grace and Lacey strengthened the right hand side. In the closing stages Lottie showed great skill and determination as well as a great left foot as she powered a goal into the top corner to give us a 2-1 win.

This meant that the girls finished as runners-up, an absolutely fantastic achievement. Their desire, passion and work ethic were a joy to see and they fully deserve all the congratulations they get. Mr Morrison, the PE department and the whole school are very proud of their achievements and can't wait to see them develop in the future.

15 year 9 girls attended a 'This Girl Can' event run by the Lancashire School Games Partnership. The pupils travelled by minibus to Roefield Sports Centre in Clitheroe and were introduced to a number of new sports showing determination, resilience and teamwork. Yoga was our first sport and once the giggles stopped the pupils made some great progress and learnt how yoga has a number of health benefits when taking part. Our second sport was an orienteering treasure hunt based around the grounds of the sports centre with a Disney theme, with one of our teams coming 3rd out of 10 teams, it showed a great level of knowledge of map reading and eagerness to succeed. Volleyball was the girls' favourite and final sport where all involved learnt a number of rules and techniques to ensure a full game could be played. Well Done to all the pupils involved.

Gender Stereotypes, Power and Equality

Over this half term Y8 students have engaged in sessions on 'Gender Stereotypes, Power and Equality'. During the sessions, students were encouraged to discuss what they see, hear and believe around expectations of men and women based upon their gender. We talk about why we have the expectations we have in terms of behaviour, appearance, likes, dislikes and the sorts of societal roles that are considered 'usual' for men and women. We talked about whether we agree or disagree and the reasons why, along with the potential dangers/issues stereotypes can cause and the barriers to challenging them such as misogyny, misandry and homophobia. We also discussed the fact that we all have differing opinions based upon our own values, beliefs and personal experiences and were encouraged to debate and discuss these differences. Students engaged well and we had some really interesting discussions around the topic.

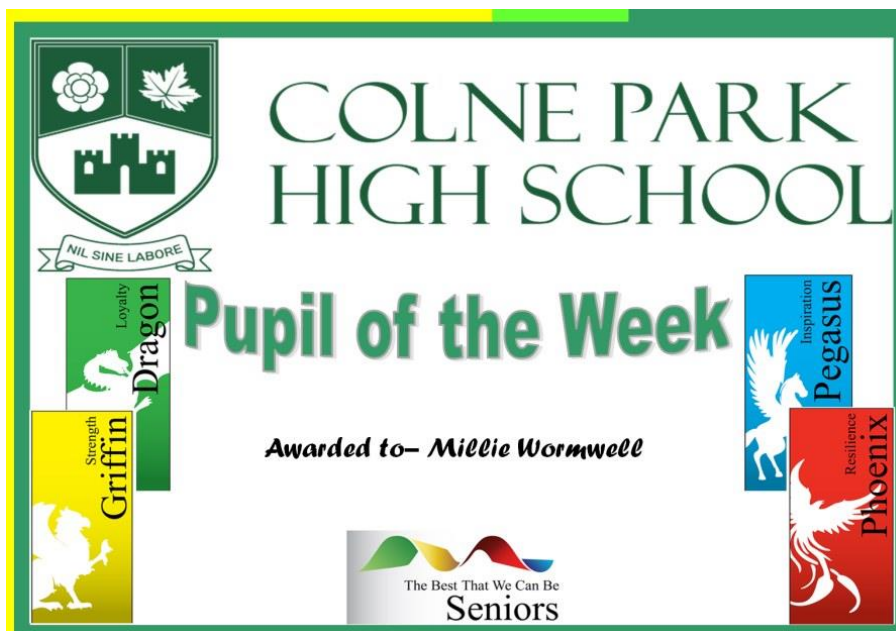
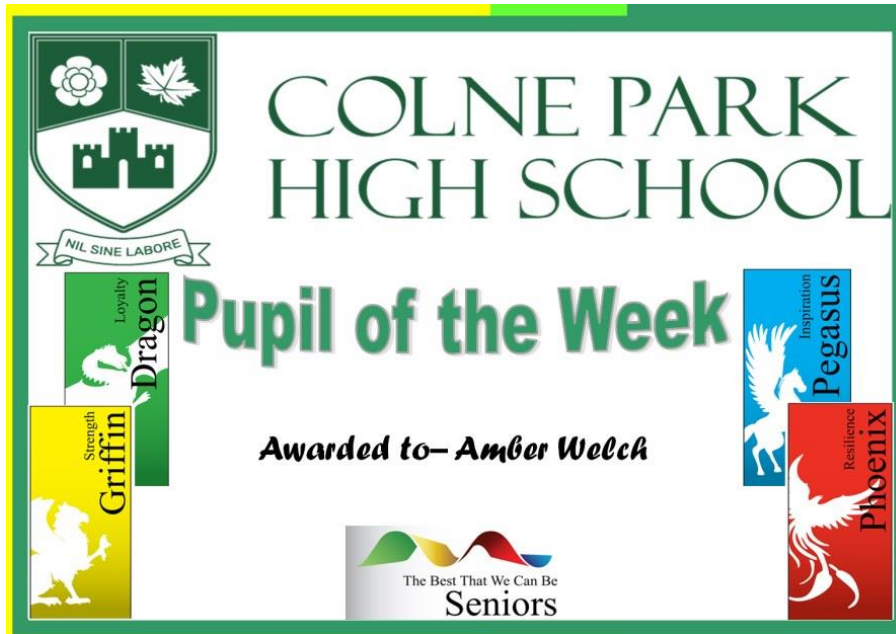

Students with Medical Needs Information

As we continue to work alongside healthcare professionals and as part of our continued drive to ensure we support our students with medical needs, we wanted to share the following information regarding care plans.

- If a child requires an EpiPen in school, a care plan needs to be completed by the health professional prescribing the pen. This would normally be a specialist/hospital doctor/allergy clinic. School nurses are not able to complete care plans for anaphylaxis.

- Any child with Epilepsy who is prescribed rescue medication, i.e. buccal midazolam, should have a care plan completed by the Epilepsy Team.



- Asthma care plans can be completed by the Asthma Specialist Nurses if one is required.
- Any child diagnosed with Diabetes will have a care plan completed by the Paediatric Diabetic Specialist Team, who can also provide training in school if this is needed.
- As regards care plans for other medical conditions, if there is a specialist team involved, they would be best placed to complete the care plan. Otherwise care plans can be completed by school in consultation with parents.

Home-School Transport- Season Ticket Renewals and New Applicants academic year 25/26

Your school may be served by one or more county council contracted school bus services. The county council School Transport Team have asked us to share the following information:

- For children who are not eligible for Home-to-School transport assistance, it is a parent/carer's responsibility to get their child to school. However, where there is spare capacity on the school buses, Lancashire County Council offer the facility for parents/carers to purchase a discounted annual season ticket. Spaces are limited and allocated on a first come, first served basis. The county council will not provide extra services for non-statutory pupils.
- Season ticket renewals – The county council has just begun the renewal process for next academic year (25/26). This means that those who currently hold season tickets have been invited to renew their tickets for next year. We advise renewals to be returned by 1st June. The process of re-applying is done using the paper application form sent to the current user in the post. Parents should be reminded that if they haven't received their child's renewal form to email the School Transport Team: schooltransport@lancashire.gov.uk
- New applicants - From 1st June, parents/carers can make an online application for a season ticket pack for 25/26 via the following link: [School bus season tickets - Lancashire County Council](#). The packs are dispatched from July onwards. Please be advised it can take 15 working days from requesting the season ticket application pack. Once application packs are received by parent/carers, they must be completed and returned to the county council as directed.

Please note that the terms and conditions of using the school bus service state that when a student boards the bus, they must either present the driver with a valid pass/season ticket or pay the bus fare. Some of the county council's school bus services operate a 'pass only' policy, therefore any late applications for season tickets may not receive their pass for the start of the 25/26 academic year and will not be able to board the bus until they can show a valid pass/season ticket.

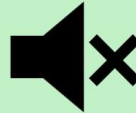
