Year 10 Boys Football: Another fine display from our Y10 team in the Pendle League, beating West Craven 4-1. At half-time, the lads were 1-0 up after a superb strike from Alfie who struck the ball powerfully into the net from outside the box. After half-time, West Craven applied pressure for the first 10 minutes of the second half before goals from Harry and a long-distance strike from Marley gave Park some breathing space. West Craven did pull one back with a penalty. Park then hit the woodwork 3 times, but the game was wrapped up with a second goal for Alfie. A special mention to Lennox who was relentless throughout the match.

Year 9/10 Girls Netball: Tonight, we had another fantastic performance from our year 9 and 10 Netball teams who both won their matches against Fisher More. We had a 7-3 win for year 9 and a strong 24-11 win for our year 10 team who continue to develop together as a very talented and capable team. Some outstanding game play seen on both courts with Fisher More testing us in defence which led to the Park attackers digging in to break down this effective defence by demonstrating accurate passing and shooting skills throughout the game. Park defenders remained solid on both courts to ensure that Fisher More had to work extra hard to break through our defence to score their goals. All players contributed to the excellent final scores tonight, demonstrating fantastic skills, enthusiasm and sheer hard work to achieve great wins in both the year 9 & 10 games. Well done girls, we were proud to be Park tonight!

Year 7 Girls Football: A fantastic debut for our Year 7 Girls Football team as they took on Mount Carmel in their first Lancashire Cup tie experience! Despite a tough start, with Carmel applying early pressure and scoring two quick goals within the first 15 minutes, the Park girls showed incredible resilience and determination. Rather than letting their heads drop, they dug deep and began to showcase their talent and teamwork. After halftime, Park came out much stronger and dominated large parts of the second half. Lucy was outstanding in

midfield, displaying superb determination and composure to launch quick counter-attacks. Claudia stood strong in defence, timing her tackles and interceptions perfectly to stop Carmel's attacks. Orla and Frankie also impressed with their tireless work rate, constantly pressing and creating attacking opportunities. Gracie led the line brilliantly as a lone striker, showing great physicality and making dangerous runs that kept the opposition defence on their toes. While the result didn't go our way, the performance was full of promise. Considering it was their first game together, the girls should be extremely proud. There's no doubt this team has huge potential – with more time and experience, success will surely follow!

U16's Girls Football: On Thursday the U16 had a Lancashire Cup football fixture against Rossall. On the day of the game with a number of players unavailable at short notice we only had 9 players. However, the girls were determined they wanted to play and give it their best, despite knowing how difficult this would be. Playing against a well drilled and highly skilled Rossall side the girls acquitted themselves superbly. Despite the final scoreline being an 8-1 defeat every single one of them did themselves and the school proud as they worked until the very last minute. It was a performance full of courage, determination and resilience and we are extremely proud of their efforts. We are still in the English Schools Cup and hopefully our squad will be back up to full numbers for the game against Brownedge St. Marys with the date to be confirmed. A huge well done to the girls.
