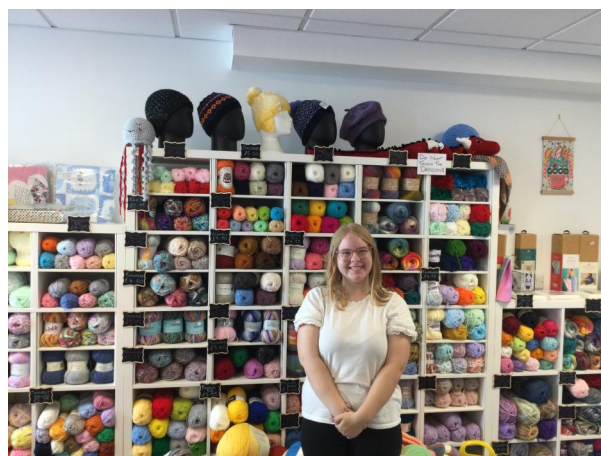


Y10 Work Experience

Students have thoroughly enjoyed a trip to UK Parliament this week in hot conditions of 32 degrees. They have climbed 334 steps to a height of 96m to the top of Big Ben, where they marvelled at the views below of St Paul's Cathedral, 10 Downing Street and Buckingham Palace. They climbed to Elizabeth Tower to listen to the chiming of the bells and learn about the mechanisms of the clock. They then had a tour behind the face of the clock tower itself and learnt about the glass panelling and the clock hands. Students asked some insightful questions throughout the tour, showed excellent listening skills, and upheld our core value of respect towards all members of staff. Students were then lucky enough to meet our local MP for Pendle and Clitheroe, Jonathan Hinder, for a Q-A session, where they quizzed him about the recent bill to ban social media for under 16's, how to become an MP, and even about his support for our 3G football pitch proposal in Parliament!

Throughout the trip, students behaved excellently and made us proud to be Park. Well done team!

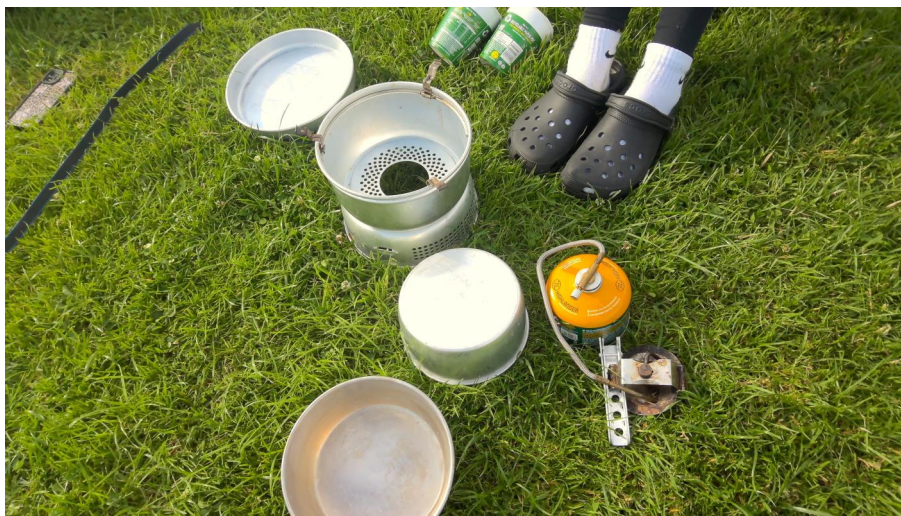




Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh Final Expedition Part 2

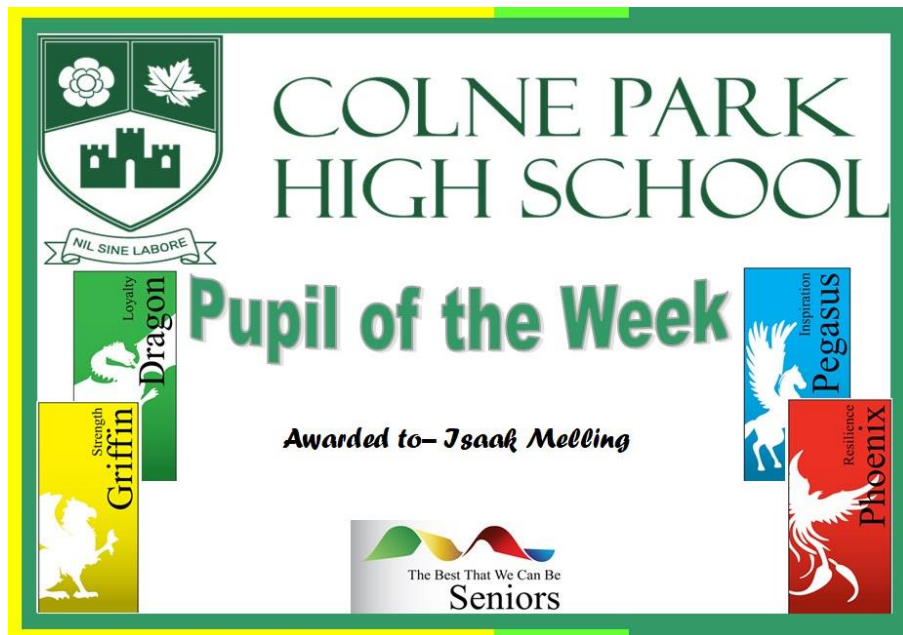

What is Nest Lancashire?
Nest Lancashire is funded by Lancashire's Police and Crime Commissioner to support young people across the county who have been affected by crime or subjected to threats or harassment. Young people can talk to us in confidence and all of our services are free of charge. Our aim is to help these young people to recover from whatever it is they have experienced. Trusted, friendly staff will be able to help them move forward and feel safe again.

Who is the service for?
Nest Lancashire supports anyone aged 13-18 who has been either a victim or a witness of crime or experienced an incident that has left them shaken. It doesn't matter if the crime or incident hasn't been reported to the police or if it happened a long time ago.
Young people don't always identify as victims and are sometimes unsure whether what has occurred does amount to a crime. We can help any young person that feels victimised or has witnessed something that has left them shaken. There is no incident too small for us to offer support.

What support is available?
We provide individual support tailored to the young person's needs. Young people can talk to us over the phone, in person, email or via social media. We will talk to the person to get to know them and decide the best way forward together.

We can offer:

- One to one support
- Group sessions with other young people
- Access to sport and other social activities
- Confidence building
- Help to ensure young people feel safe and secure again
- Support in reporting the crime if the young person would like to do so
- Information about young people's rights on a victim of crime
- Support for young people throughout the process if a case goes to court
